Thank you, Drs Edward and Stephanie Neeman for a wonderful historic instruments concert and thanks to all who enthusiastically joined with the Friends of the School of Music on the stage of Llewellyn Hall to see and hear Edward and Stephanie's virtuosity on these extraordinary instruments and Edward's fascinating comments on both the instruments and music.

Thanks to everyone who participated - your support raises funds to help the Friends continue to provide grants and prizes to students at the ANU School of Music.

STUDENT GRANTS

At the July meeting of the Friends Committee, it decided to award recording grants to the following students:

- Harriett Blaazer-Grossi for a short CD of original compositions, inspired by the folk tradition augmented by jazz improvisation,
- Ariel Nurhadi (PhD, guitar) for an album of solo performed works written for Andres Segovia,
- Jack Schwenke for an album of original content played by a jazz trio including himself and by other SOM students
- Callum Henshaw (PhD, guitar) for his solo performed CD album *Echo & Return* released in April 2016,
- Brendan Keller-Tuberg for an album of his own jazz compositions performed by himself and two recent graduates

In making these decisions the Committee took into account whether students had previously received Friends' grants, whether they had contributed to our fund-raising concerts; whether they were undergraduates or postgraduates (with therefore other sources of income) and the proportion of the recording costs they were seeking.

The Committee also agreed to award **Joy Kerr** (honours composition) a small grant to enable her to attend the Australian National Band and Orchestra Conference in Sydney from 23-26 September 2016.
